THE WORD FROM THE WEST

MEDALS AND AWARDS

DISCOMBOBULATED DISCHARGE

At the end of my enlistment, I had over 40 days of accumulated leave saved up, and along with the rest of the VA-12 Flying Ubangis, I was overseas on a Med cruise on-board CV-69 Dwight D. Eisenhower.

The basic procedure at that time was to process sailors out of the Navy from commands at NAS Jacksonville, so I was shipped back to the States and ended up reporting in to Personnel there.

My presence there at NAS Jacksonville, instead of Cecil Field, was one amongst a small pool of odd events during those "Discharge Days" and I always wondered if everything was kosher about some parts of the whole deal. For instance, I was not awarded any medals or awards.

LETS INVESTIGATE

So let's advance to the modern era. I read an item recently that claims most enlisted military veterans serve their 4 years of duty and are rarely awarded all of the decorations and medals that they deserve and have earned.

I decided to investigate this as it applies to my own case. Several years back I wrote a letter to a specific Navy office involved in the control of personnel records, and never heard

a peep back from them. Not one word. Silly me, what else was I expecting?

So I decided to try putting one of our Senators offices onto the job and see what they could do for me.

THE LETTER

Here is the text of the letter I sent. Anyone interested in trying this for themselves could use a similar text, or steal parts of this that apply in your own case.

Senator Boogers,

I am writing to see if some review of my record of military service in the US Navy can be conducted to determine if I am due the award of possibly 2 different service medals.

MILITARY SERVICE

I served a 4-year enlistment in the US Navy. I was awarded an Honorable Discharge. Additionally, I served some time in the Navy Reserves, and also a short period in the Air National Guard. Here is a list of the services and dates.

US Navy 4 Apr 1975 to 4 Apr 1979

Navy Reserve 10 Oct 1981 to 14 Jan 1983

Oregon Air National Guard 5 Feb 1983 to 15 Jun 1983

MEDALS EARNED BUT NEVER AWARDED

At the time of my discharge from Active Duty, and again during my service in both the Navy Reserve and the Oregon Air National Guard, I am not convinced that my records were ever properly and completely reviewed to determine if I was eligible to receive any awards.

After some research, I now believe that I am qualified to be awarded at least two different medals for that service:

GOOD CONDUCT

SEA SERVICE DEPLOYMENT

There may be others but I am not aware that I qualify for any of them besides these two.

I served faithfully and honorably for the times noted above. I believe that I meet the criteria for these two awards listed, and that any review of my records will prove that I deserve them. It has always bothered me that they were never awarded to me at the time. I believe that they should have been. And so now, after the passage of all these years, I have a measure of hope that you and your staff can find a way to rectify this injustice. Attached is a copy of my "DD214". This was issued to me at the time of my discharge from Active Duty with the Navy, in April 1979. This is only a copy of the original, if you need a notarized copy please let me know.

If you need any other information, or if I would need to contact some other office or group, once again please let me know. Thank You sincerely in advance for your time in looking into this matter.

THE PAYOFF

It actually worked! Within weeks I heard back from the Senators office that I had earned three medals for my service, not two. A few days later I even got a mailing from the Navy which contained two of the three. I was on my own if I wanted

to obtain uniform ribbons.

NOTES:

1. The actual mailing address of your senator(s) is available from a wide variety of sources close to you. Look in the blue Government pages of your phone book. Look on the editorial page of your Sunday paper. CALL your local newspaper.
2. I was also awarded the NATIONAL DEFENSE medal. I knew that the criteria for this medal had been changed and I had the mistaken impression that it was no longer awarded to service members from my era. But they gave me one so I guess the criteria has been changed back.
3. Some awards come in both medal and ribbon formats. Some only come in ribbon format.

Please note that the basic format of my letter above is pretty short and simple and gets to the point quickly. This ought to work for you too. I think that the staff in these offices appreciate this and it helps them get started delegating tasks more quickly. I am sure that Senator Snort N. D. The region's favorable climate makes outdoor activity around Las Vegas an attractive option year-round.

Hoover Dam is an engineering wonder of the world just 35 miles (56 kilometers) southeast of Las Vegas. Formerly named Boulder Dam, this historic man-made creation tamed the mighty Colorado River and created North America's largest man-made lake, Lake Mead. The 726-foot-high, arch-gravity dam is 660 feet thick and forever changed the face of the western United States. On-site tours of the dam are available to the public throughout the year.

Mt. Charleston is 35 miles (56 kilometers) from Las Vegas, with its highest elevation at 11,918 feet (3,615 meters). An average of 20 to 30 degrees cooler than Las Vegas, Mt. Charleston is perfect for skiing, picnicking, hiking and horseback riding. In addition to year-round hotel accommodations and tours, full-service camping is also available from May through September. For information, call (702) 873-8800.

Red Rock Canyon is just 15 miles (24 kilometers) west of Las Vegas. It is a scenic area of rock formations and desert with a 3,000-foot (910-meter) escarpment produced by a thrust fault. Open to the public year-round and a popular destination for hikers, bikers, joggers and rock climbers, Red Rock Canyon offers a Bureau of Land Management visitors center and is home to feral horses, wild burros, bighorn sheep, coyotes and a variety of desert plant life.

Valley of Fire State Park is only 55 miles (88 kilometers) northwest of Las Vegas and comprises scenic landscapes, hidden canyons and unique red rock formations. Petroglyphs and remains of ancient Native American civilizations can be viewed here and a Nevada Park Service visitors center provides tourist information. The park is open to the public year-round and tours are available.

Mojave National Preserve is only 60 miles (97 kilometers) southwest of Las Vegas. This 1.6-million-acre preserve, which protects one of the most diverse environments in the world, abounds with sand dunes, volcanic cinder cones, Joshua tree forests and mile-high mountains. The preserve's visitor centers, located in Baker and Needles, Calif., welcome visitors year-round.

Death Valley is located in western California, 135 miles (216 kilometers) from Las Vegas. This scenic wonder has the lowest elevation on the North American continent at 280 feet (84.93 meters) below sea level. Points of interest include Zabriskie Point, 20 Mule Team Canyon and Scotty's Castle.

Tours are available.

Grand Canyon West, a destination owned and operated by the Hualapai Tribe at the Grand Canyon's western rim, opened The Skywalk last year. This modern-day marvel is the first-ever cantilever-shaped glass walkway to suspend more than 4,000 feet above the canyon's floor and extend 70 feet from the canyon's rim. Envisioned by Las Vegas-based entrepreneur David Jin, The Skywalk was designed by MRJ Architects and is located 120 miles east of Las Vegas at Grand Canyon West's Eagle Point.

Bryce Canyon is located 210 miles (336 kilometers) northeast of Las Vegas in southwestern Utah. This popular national park offers an outdoor exhibition of unique rock formations with imaginative names like Pink Cliffs, Silent City and Cathedral. Bryce Canyon is open throughout the year.

Shop Till You Drop

If you want it, Vegas has it. From designer splurges to bargain deals, Las Vegas has become a one-stop shopping Mecca. Everything from colorful souvenir shops to haute couture boutiques can be found in retail centers along the Las Vegas Strip and surrounding areas.

The Forum Shops at Caesars Palace with more than 526,000 square feet of retail space features 160 shops and boutiques such as Harry Winston, Ted Baker, Thomas Pink, Nanette Lepore and Vosges Haut Chocolats. Gucci, Guess, Christian Dior, NikeTown and Fendi, plus 13 restaurants and specialty food shops such as Wolfgang Puck's Spago, Joe's Stone Crab, Il Mulino, Sushi Roku and Boa Steakhouse.

The Fashion Outlets of Las Vegas shopping mall in Primm, Nev., features more than 100 brand names such as DKNY, Calvin Klein, Kenneth Cole, Banana Republic, Williams-Sonoma, Harley-Davidson, Alpaca Pete's, Bath & Body Works and Wilson's Leather. It is located at the Southern Nevada/California border, 35 miles south of Las Vegas off of Interstate 15. Shuttle bus service is available from the Las Vegas Strip as well as from New York-New York Hotel & Casino and MGM Grand.

VALUE-ADDED VEGAS

For those looking to make the most of their travel budget while visiting the "Entertainment Capital of the World," there are myriad options for the value-conscious visitor. Here are just a few:

Free attractions line the Las Vegas Strip and they're not hard to find. **The Mirage's volcano** erupts in a lagoon filled with waterfalls and palm trees every 15 minutes from dusk to midnight. The Mirage is renovating its famed volcano and will reopen the attraction by the end of 2008. The volcano at The Mirage has mesmerized spectators since the resort opened in 1989.

Next door, nightly passersby can catch the **"Sirens of TI" at Treasure Island**. The revamped version showcases the popular pyrotechnic war as male renegade pirates battle "sexy sirens" of Sirens' Cove. Performances run every 90 minutes beginning at 7 p.m.

Meanwhile, the world-famous **Fountains at Bellagio** thrill

visitors with more than 1,000 water-emitting devices choreographed to music by artists such as Frank Sinatra, Elton John, Whitney Houston and Andrea Bocelli. Newport, RI with its yachts, mansions, Ocean Drive and restaurants galore, is about 45 minutes up the line. Cape Cod is about another 45 minutes beyond. Then there's "Bean Town" (Boston), about

90 minutes away and Maine about three hours away with L.L.Bean in Freeport. Don't forget New Hampshire's White Mountains and Lake Winnepesaukee, and Vermont's Green Mountains and Lake Champlain. From the quaint to the opulent – we've got it all!

For those just in for the Reunion - some of the activities/sites in the area include Foxwoods or Mohegan Sun Casinos, Westbrook Mall (shopping), Golfing, Mystic Seaport, Old Mystic Village. Mystic Aquarium, Mashantucket Pequot Museum and Research Center, USS Nautilus Museum, and plenty of New England Clam Chowda – all within about 30 minutes. There's a possibility of having a dinner cruise on Long Island Sound, or a New Eng.
